environmental multi stakeholder dialogue on development in its global sense, the strengthening of the focal points of the working groups and national coalitions of COMIFAC and finally, a plea to finance the COMIFAC and revitalize the working of the COMIFAC.

On another level, and in order to harmonize such policies, the organization of sub-regional fora will be required.

Thus it is expected promotion of international agreements and conventions, to support and harmonize the policies mentioned above, opportunities have been taken into account

at the end of "side events" met parallel, such as the Assembly General for ITTO (International Tropical Timber Organization) in Yokohama (Japan) or the United Nations Forum on Forests (UNFF).

We can also cite the promotion of the Convention on Migratory Species and the promotion of forest law at local and sub regional enhanced.

In 2011, a study on the economic and social contribution of forests was launched, the publication will be made in 2012, this is an initiative for Facilitating the development and implementation of projects and

the fight against poverty in the Congo Basin.

In conclusion, FPCB considers many parameters, including the mobilization of partners, the establishment of a network of communicators in the basin and the FPCB is presented as a transmission belt and a strong for integration of the equality women men (gender) in the sustainable management of natural resources in the Congo Basin.

Also involved, promotion of a constructive and efficient support partners from CEFDHAC at national and sub regional levels. And enhanced support to indig-

enous peoples of Central Africa, this resulted in the 2nd edition of IFIP (International Forum of Indigenous Peoples), with significant progress on the issue of indigenous peoples.

Still in the context of mobilization, a policy encouraging the accession of new partners and a definition of roles is taking shape. For example, the definition of intervention levels for partners in the process REDD+ in Central Africa. Clearly, the facilitation by his many contributions is likely to achieve the above objectives. ■
